ORDINANCE(S) - SECOND READING & FINAL DISPOSITION

ORDINANCE NO. 13 - 2010 OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON, AMENDING THE CODE OF
THE CITY OF BURLINGTON TO ELIMINATE CHAPTER 10.08.040 (“STOPPING OR
STANDING”)

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Burlington (“City”) acknowledges the need to reduce the City’s operational cost under its current street sweeping plan; and

WHEREAS, the Street Sweeping Committee of the City has researched its existing street sweeping costs and services and has compared those costs and services with an outside service company who is interested in providing sweeping services; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is in the public interest to eliminate Chapter 10.08.040 of the Code of the City of Burlington (“Code”) due to rising costs in maintaining its operations and to provide flexibility to the new street sweeping service; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has determined that this change is necessary and beneficial for the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Burlington, County of Burlington and State of New Jersey that the Code is hereby amended to delete Section 10.08.040 (“Stopping or standing”) in its entirety.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication in accordance with applicable law.

Upon the motion of Councilwoman Lollar, seconded by Councilwoman Woodard, the foregoing ordinance was introduced.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER TO RELEASE THE PERFORMANCE GUARANTEE OF THOMAS LYNN HOMES, LLC

WHEREAS, the Thomas Lynn Homes, LLC has posted a performance guarantee with the City of Burlington for improvements to 15 and 17 Mill Road; and

WHEREAS, City Engineer Frank Morris, PE, CES, CPWM, has recommended that the performance guarantee be released as the improvements have been satisfactorily completed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Burlington that the performance guarantee in the amount of \$9,970.20 can be released by the Chief Financial Officer to Thomas Lynn Homes, LLC. Install 6" Quick Connect. Work includes coring the pump station manhole, installing 6" galvanized steel pipe to the manhole bench within the manhole, installing 6" galvanized pipe above grade with a quick connect fitting protected by two (2) bollards, and all excavation, backfilling, and restoration work.

WHEREAS, the City has determined that the work is necessary, negotiated the payment terms, prepared the change order form and recommends approval of Change Order #3 for E. Sambol Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Common Council of the City of Burlington, hereby authorizes the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute an amended agreement (Change Order #3) with E. Sambol Corporation, 1033 N. Maple Avenue, Toms River, NJ, in the amount of (\$5,014.95), for items related to the Mitchell Avenue Pump Station Project, making a revised

contract total of \$629,758.87.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A CONTRACT TO FIRST STUDENT, INC FOR EMERGENCY BUS TRANSPORTATION SERVICES TO AND FROM BURLINGTON CITY HIGH SCHOOL AND SIX FLAGS GREAT ADVENTURE AND AFFIRMING THE TERMINATION OF THE CITY'S CONTRACT WITH NEGBA BUS SERVICE

WHEREAS, the City of Burlington (the "City") issued an invitation to bid on a contract for bus transportation services to transport Burlington City High School students to and from their jobs at Six Flags Great Adventure for the Summer of 2010 (the "Contract"); and

WHEREAS, the Contract was awarded to Negba Bus Service ("Negba"), which was the lowest responsible bidder submitting a conforming bid; and

WHEREAS, Negba breached the terms of its Contract with the City by failing to perform its obligations as required by the bid specifications thereby placing the students' jobs with Great Adventure at risk; and

WHEREAS, on June 22, 2010, the Mayor formally terminated the City's Contract with Negba due to its non-performance; and

WHEREAS, there now exists a need to quickly replace Negba with a qualified bus company in order to avoid placing the students' employment with Six Flags Great Adventure at risk; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 allows contracts to be awarded without public bidding when an emergency affecting the public health, safety or welfare required the immediate performance of services; and

WHEREAS, the City has negotiated with First Service, Inc. to provide the Contract services for the remainder of the Summer in an amount not to exceed \$22,500.00; and

WHEREAS, City Administration recommends that the Contract be awarded to First Service, Inc.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Burlington, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey that it hereby confirms the actions of the Mayor by terminating the contract for bus transportation services for students to and from Burlington City High School and Six Flags Great Adventure awarded to Negba Bus

Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the contract for bus transportation services to transport students from Burlington City High School to their jobs at Six Flags Great Adventure for the remainder of the Summer be and hereby is awarded to First Services, Inc. and the Mayor is authorized to execute any such documents to effectuate a contract with First Services, Inc in an amount not to exceed \$22,500.00; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer has executed a Certification of Funds which is attached hereto, and that sufficient funds are available for said contract; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this Resolution shall be provided to each of the following:

WHEREAS, the Townships of Bordentown, Mansfield, North Hanover, Chesterfield, Florence and the Cities of Bordentown and Burlington are neighboring municipalities within the County of Burlington; and

WHEREAS, their Police Departments provide DWI patrols in their respective municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the municipalities often rely upon each other for additional officers to provide such services; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Bordentown has applied for and been awarded a grant for the “Burlington County DWI Task Force Program”; and

WHEREAS, the Townships wish to enter into an Interlocal Service Agreement to utilize overtime police work to enforce driving-while-intoxicated laws in the municipalities; and

WHEREAS, said Interlocal Service Agreement has been prepared by the Township of Bordentown and has been found to be acceptable by the City of Burlington; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1, et seq., the Interlocal Service Act, permits this Interlocal Service Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Burlington, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor of the City of Burlington is hereby authorized to execute the Interlocal Service Agreement with the Townships of Mansfield, Chesterfield, North Hanover, Bordentown, Florence and the City of Bordentown concerning the “Burlington County DWI Task Force Program” grant; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Chief Financial Officers and the Municipal Clerks of Mansfield Township, Chesterfield Township, North Hanover Township, Bordentown Township, Bordentown City and Burlington City.

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2009 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A.40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all member of the governing body have reviewed, at a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations"; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed at a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled; "Comments and Recommendations", as evidence by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the governing body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 - to with:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 - "A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his/her office."

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Common Council of the City to Burlington hereby states that it has complied with

N.J.A.C 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.
